Guidelines for Blog Comments

Blog posts and comments are a great way to be creative and share information with each other!

Below are some guidelines for writing comments. Just like blog posts, comments count as a form of writing, so we still need to follow the writing process. For all comments, you should:

- Start with a greeting.
- Share what you like about the post, what you learned, or why the post was interesting to you.
- Make a connection, ask a question, or give a thoughtful suggestion. Keep it relevant. :)
- End with a closing and your name.
- Revise and edit the comment. Make sure your writing is clear by reading it out loud. Start sentences with capital letters, end with punctuation, and check spelling and spacing.

What is an Artifact?

We can learn about the past in many different ways. We can study old photos, talk to people, read books about the past, or view artifacts. Artifacts are things from the past that have been left for us to study. For example, an old telephone from 1915 can be viewed, examined, and compared to the phones that we use today. If you compared the phone from 1915 to an iPhone, you would find that there are many differences and they were made very differently. Sometimes artifacts are buried or thrown away and found again when people are digging to build or are digging because they are looking for old things. People that study human history by digging for artifacts are called archaeologists. Objects that they find are studied and sometimes put into museums, libraries, or
