salt Dough Landforms!

Materials:

- •heavy cardboard
- •flour
- •salt
- •water
- •large bowl
- •tempera paint
- •scissors
- toothpicks
- •tape
- •labels on page 51



Directions:

- 1. Mix 2 cups flour, 1 cup salt and 3/4 cup water. (Add a little water at a time). This should make a very thick dough. Add more flour if needed.
- 2. Spread dough over map you or the student has outlined on heavy cardboard or plywood. Shape mountains, valleys, plains, etc. You may dip fingers lightly in water to smooth out rough places in dough.
- 3. Cut out the labels on page 51. Use tape to adhere the labels to toothpicks. Insert the toothpicks before the dough fully dries.
- 4. Allow to dry (this may take a day or two) and paint with tempera.

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

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

What is a Timeline?

It's important to know when events in the past have taken place. A simple way to show when events have happened is by using a timeline. A timeline is a diagram that shows the order of when events took place. They are important because they tell us about what happened and how much time went by between events. Historians can better understand how events took place if they look at a timeline and see the order of those events. If events on a timeline are not in the correct order, the timeline wouldn't make sense. For example, if you made a timeline of when Disney movies came out, and you put Toy Story 2

before Toy Story, it would be incorrect.

Historians need the facts and events to be placed in the correct order so the timeline can make sense.














Digital clock
